Thomas I. Bradley is Vice President of Finance & Program Management for Lockheed Martin Aeronautics Company. He is responsible for all aspects of the company's finances and program management processes, including accounting, contracts, business management, financial planning, scheduling and earned value. He was named to his current position in October 2010.

Mr. Bradley joined Lockheed Martin after a nearly 20-year career of increasingly responsible financial management, sourcing and corporate audit positions with General Electric. His last assignment with GE was as Finance Manager for the GE Silicones business in Waterford, N.Y.



He began his GE career at the company's Superabrasives business in Worthington, Ohio, moved to GE's Corporate Audit Staff in 1985, and in 1988 was appointed Senior Audit Manager in Schenectady, N.Y. He moved to GE Aerospace in 1990, serving first as Manager of Financial Planning and Analysis in the Engineering Department at Ocean, Radar & Sensor Systems, Syracuse, N.Y., and later becoming Manager of Manufacturing, Planning and Analysis for the Syracuse Operations Department.

In 1993, following the then-Martin Marietta Corporation's acquisition of the GE Aerospace businesses, Bradley joined the Martin Marietta Material Acquisition Center in Utica, N.Y., serving as Director of Electrical Procurement and Program Proposals. He returned to GE in 1995.

In 1999 he rejoined Lockheed Martin as Vice President-Finance for the Lockheed Martin Systems Integration Business Area in 1999. In 2002, Mr. Bradley was appointed Vice President of Finance and Business Operations for the corporation's Space Systems Company and assigned the same position for Lockheed Martin Aeronautics Company in September 2007.

Bradley has served on the board of directors for the United Launch Alliance (ULA), the joint space launch services venture between Lockheed Martin and Boeing, since December 2006. He has also served as a member of the International Board of Visitors for the Texas Christian University (TCU) Neeley School of Business since April 2010.
